Try making your own action painting, like this one!





Jackson Pollock dripped and poured paint freely over canvas. He was able to put all his feelings onto the paper which made amazing patterns!

You will need:

- large sheet of paper / roll of craft paper
- newspaper
- black paint
- yellow paint

What to do:



Put a large piece of paper on the floor on top of some newspaper.




Pour black poster paint in a squidgy bottle and add a bit of water if the paint is thick.



Put some music on. Maybe try some jazz music.



Shake the bottle of paint (with the lid on!).



Pour the paint all over the paper using the music to guide you.

Leave it to dry.



Look at your painting and turn it all the way around to find the best way up, then with a brush or fingers add touches of colour.
