Multiple Histories and Transnational Narratives: Re-Orienting European Museums

In recent years, museums across Europe have committed to expanded readings of art and sought to advance this vision in dialogue with renewed artistic and intellectual communities. This approach is critical of the way museum collections first emerged and highlights the national, colonial and racial ideologies that underpinned the birth and development of art history. Many museums of modern and contemporary art have therefore reimagined their programme and reinterpreted their collections by questioning Eurocentric narratives of modernity. Their research initiatives thus seek to contribute to new histories of art. By comparing these perspectives, the seminar will address the emergence of these transnational readings. It will bring together, among others, museum professionals and scholars who have led research projects that reinterpret museum collections and programmes.
